High Impact Instruction

75% of Seven Springs Middle School students will achieve mastery of grade level standards through engaging standards based instruction as measured by 2018 Florida Standards Assessment.

Teachers will participate in Professional Learning Communities, plan instructional units, and create common formative and summative assessments.

PLC members will analyze quarterly data utilizing Quarterly Data Chat Protocol and discussion of common assessment data.

Teachers will be trained in the components of the Instructional Practice Guide.

Students will be proficient on the measured standards on the quarterly checks.

Common assessments will measure mastery of grade level standards.

Data Driven Decisions

Seven Springs Middle School will decrease the number of students earning a "D" or "F" grade by 7% as compared to 2016 as measured by EWS data.

Why Try will be utilized in Saturday Detention.

School counselors will implement Why Try lessons with at-risk students based on EWS data.

SRO will provide GREAT lessons through 6th grade social studies classes.



SSAP teachers will monitor and work with students who are struggling academically and not attending school.

Student Service Counselor will work with students who have multiple referrals.

Teams document students and interventions on a Google Doc monthly to monitor success during the EWS meetings.

Review EWS data to identify at-risk students.

EWS meetings will be held quarterly with team and school counselor or grade level administrator to address student needs and possible interventions.

Tier 1 Academic: Teams will conference and communicate via My Learning, MyStudent, progress reports and report cards, phone calls and emails.

Tier 2 Academic: Students in need of support will be scheduled into intensive reading or intensive math as needed.

SSAP teachers will be assigned to students who have failed core content area class(es) and have attendance issues. The SSAP teachers will provide academic support in the learning lab as well as push into classrooms. SSAP teachers and student support counselor classroom will establish a mentor program for students meeting this criteria.

Students in need of support will be offered ESY opportunities and academic support during study hall.



Collaborative Culture

Seven Springs Middle School will increase student attendance and decrease the percentage of students being absent for more than 10 days by 7% based on 2016 data.
